Notes:

1. A Master's degree comprises 56 credits. It depends on Recognized Prior Learning how many of these 56 credits are actually necessary.
2. Students, who are eligible to be admitted to postgraduate studies although they do not have undergraduate level theological training, are required to successfully complete a **Postgraduate Induction Program** before they can start their 56-credit postgraduate study program. This Postgraduate Induction Program consists of culture-specific 3-credit modules from Systematic Theology, Historical Theology, Biblical Theology, Practical Theology, Missiology (Intercultural Studies) plus a Practical Project, totaling 18 credits.
3. Core modules (i.e. compulsory courses) are displayed in bold. Some might be more relevant in certain contexts than in others. The Chief Academic Officer

and Registrar reserve the right to determine, which courses are compulsory, as they see fit.

4. The other modules will be chosen by the Chief Academic Officer/Registrar and allocated mentor in conjunction with the student in light of his/her ministry calling and gifts.
5. The Master's degree also includes a practical project (4 credits) and a 25,000-word dissertation (16 credits).
6. All students will be enrolled in NEO, our LMS. Every module contains module descriptors, free PDF literature, a study guide (if appropriate), lectures/videos, at least one quiz, and the student feedback form that needs to be returned at the end of the module.
